The Average Man



DIRECTIONS TO THE SABINIS:



Busy Bodies


Only two sightings this month that I haven't already shared via email.

- This may have circulated before, but here's a nice quote by author Kurt Vonnegut that also goes a long way to explaining his writing style. "I grew up at a time in this country when comedy was superb. There were large numbers of absolutely top comedians. And without intending to, I really studied them. I would listen to comedy at least an hour a night all through my youth, and I got very interested in what jokes were and how they worked. I used to laugh my head off at Laurel and Hardy. There is terrible tragedy there somehow. These men are too sweet to survive in this world and are in terrible danger all the time. They could be so easily killed. ... Humor is an almost physiological response to fear ... and a great deal of laughter is induced by fear..."
